Introduction

3. Ground Cleaning

A campus cleaning drive was conducted in the college playground and surrounding areas. Dry leaves, paper waste, and plastic litter were collected and disposed of scientifically.

4. Plastic Collection Drive

Students collected plastic waste from the campus and segregated it for recycling. Awareness was given on avoiding single-use plastics.

5. Awareness Session

Faculty members explained the importance of waste segregation, recycling, and maintaining a litter-free environment.
